NETWORK

- Emerge to meet needs of enormous scale that transcend the capacity of individual agencies
- Collaborative Governance: Networking among public, private and nonprofit sectors to achieve public purposes.
- Power among autonomous actors in a relatively "flat" structure.





- Collaborative network that <u>enhances the</u> <u>power of all members</u> to make practical, measurable changes.
- Each interest group is an autonomous actor.
- Not controlled by hierarchy.
- Controlled by consensus each member agrees to contribute whatever resources they can to carrying out action to address the common problem.

Network



- Agreement is only one step in facilitating the concerted effort(s) of the network.
- The commitment is to function as part of the collaborative network to achieve a solution beyond reach of any single actor within this voluntary structure.
- The *network focuses on the doing as the goal* and not only the decision about what should be done.



Weaving a Collaborative Network

- Christina Fulsom was selected 8.1.12 as
 Interim Leader becomes the *Network Weaver*
 - Role is <u>transitional</u>
 - Brings isolated groups into working relationships as an effective network.
 - Combines community organizing and collaborative leadership.
 - Organizes diverse and creative ideas of numerous contributors without centralizing power and decision-making.



Phases of Network Weaving

Isolated local groups

Hub and spoke


Multiple hubs

Core/Periphery





- Network weaver first develops relationships with each local group separately.
- Weaver is connected to each group but they are not connected to one another.








- Weaver builds relationships across the boundaries that kept local groups isolated.
- Facilitate limited collaborations among them.
- Training of committed participants to share responsibility more widely.
- Weaver is transitional... individuals comprise a core group. They invest more time and energy than most participants; they take on the role of "hubs".





- Network now has separate, but larger, local networks with multiple hubs or weavers.
- Begin creating loose ties with one another, through individual relationships (dashed lines).
- Core leaders deepen ties into stronger bonds based on collaborative efforts.







- Role of weavers changes.
- Step aside from "hub" position and let crossboundary relationships continue.
- Role shifts to working with a diverse network and helping shape them for implementation.






- Finally a very different structure.
- There is a core group of the most active members in the center.
- Around them as the great majority of the participants.
- Each participant contributes whatever skills and ideas they want to offer.
- Core group takes the creative inputs and turns it into workable proposals for problem solving.






 Core continues to work in a collaborative manner and maintain active dialogue about proposed solutions or projects with the rest of the network.






